

In 1996 Bob, started production of the national, weekly PBS program, *About Your House with Bob Yapp*. Bob was executive producer, writer and host for this National Trust for His-

toric Preservation sponsored fifty-two show series. Since leaving PBS in 2001, Bob has dedicated himself to preservation education.

KEYNOTE ADDRESS FEATURING JOHN LAMBERT

Fallingwater - Cementing its Legacy

As owner of Abstract Masonry Restoration, **John Lambert** is a well-known contractor and consultant in Utah. In 2007, he received Utah Heritage Foundation's highest honor in preservation, the Lucybeth Rampton Lifetime Achievement Award.

Utilizing his personal philosophy of preservation, John will speak to his role as lead concrete and stone restoration trainer/consultant on one of America's most-esteemed architectural landmarks — Fallingwater — and how physical challenges at the property can also challenge personal preservation philosophy.

Designed by Frank Lloyd Wright atop a waterfall in the mountains of western Pennsylvania, Fallingwater is one of the most revered and extraordinary houses of the 20th century. Built primarily of

concrete and stone in 1936-1937 amidst harsh exposure conditions, these materials have suffered significant deterioration. Proper conservation or restoration of the historic concrete and stone have proven exceptionally challenging, but gaining first-hand insights can benefit the respectful restoration of Utah's midcentury modern buildings. **THIS IS A FREE PUBLIC EVENT.**

The University Historic District is located on the Salt Lake Valley's east bench immediately west of the University of Utah campus. Listed on the National Register of Historic Places and designated as a local historic district, over 80% of the buildings are considered contributing to the historic character of the neighborhood. The tree-lined sidewalks and streets, wide grass medians, and uniform setbacks set the stage for an enjoyable walk through the historic architecture of one of Utah's great neighborhoods.




